Title of the Best Practice: Institutional Commitment towards Sustainable Development Goals

The United Nations General Assembly adopted the Sustainable Development Goals by its resolution A/RES/70/1 of 25th September 2015. Sustainable Development Goals aim at ending all forms of poverty, fighting inequalities, tackling climate change and granting peace and prosperity by 2030. All the higher education institutions have their duties beyond the boundaries of their campuses too. The institution has been successfully shouldering its social and global responsibilities by navigating its activities in the direction of these Sustainable Development Goals.

Objectives of the Practice:

- To develop in students the understanding and awareness of complex global issues
- To strengthen the sense of togetherness by working towards the same objective
- To strive for the attainment of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- To help carry the promise of a better world forward.
- To make the students sensitive human beings aware of their responsibilities at various levels

The Context

One of the missions of the institution is "To develop in students the understanding and awareness of complex global issues and the core competencies to overcome them." In pursuance of our mission, the college has been orienting its activities towards the achievement of Sustainable Development Goals. Although, modestin substance, our efforts propagate our belief in 'Vasudhaiv kutumbakam' and give us a sense of fulfilment. The activities conducted within the campus and outside the campus support our steps towards these goals. Theactivities carried out by the two units of NSS, two wings of NCC, Swami Vivekananda Career Counselling Cell and Eco Clubhave given a new impetus to it. The activities are also supported by students and teachersfurthering the cause in collaboration with a number of government and non-government organisations.

The Practice:

A brief overview of some of the activities conducted within and outside the campus will validate our claim of institutional commitment to these goals.

Institutional aim "to provide holistic education capable of developing employability" contributes to the goal of No Poverty and Zero Hunger. A large number of skill development programmes, short term job-oriented training programmes and the incubation centre develop the skills of the students, enhance the employability of the students and thus aim at reducing poverty and hunger. Various scholarships are given to students coming from ESDGs. Sometimes the faculty members pay the admission fee and the examination fee of the poor students. Faculty members along with the students visit remote villages and slum areas, donate clothes, books, food items and other items of daily use.

Since profitable agriculture, economic self-dependence and improved nutrition are directly related to one another, during the seven day camps of NSS units and during the visits to adopted villages, the welfare policies of government are disseminated to the villages to help them start self-employmentand adopt resilient and sustainable agricultural practices.

Keeping the dictum of 'Healthy Mind in a Healthy Body' in mind, the college gives equal importance to the good health and well-being of students and staff. Clean water and sanitation are essential components for good health and well-being, so cleanliness is ensured in the campus and the nearbyvillages. Yoga and Meditation, sports and games are regular activities of the institution. Doctors are invited to conduct medical check-up for both students and staff. Programmes such as 'Shudhhake Liye Yuddha', 'Nutrition Week' 'Fit India Campaign', 'AIDS Awareness Programme', 'Hair Donation for Cancer Patients',

'Vaccination drives', 'Cleanliness Drives' 'Blood Donation Camps', 'Awareness about Family Planning', 'Awareness for Sanitation' 'De-addiction Campaign' are conducted.

'Anti-tobacco Day,' 'Traffic Security Week' are celebrated to safeguard the lives of the human beings.

Mental Health Workshops, Yoga and Meditation, Mentor-mentee Scheme and Counselling facility are there for stress management. Visits to Anganwadi centres and old age homes also provide first-hand knowledge of the burning issues of malnutrition and well-being along with the understanding of their solutions.

The vaccination centre established in the institution, during the COVID-19, ensured the vaccination of thousands of people and achieved the goal of hundred percent vaccinations of the college staff and students. The volunteers of NSS served incessantly during the pandemic without caring for their lives, distributing essentials such as masks, clothes, eatables, medicines and spreading awareness through various ways against the fatal disease.

Goal 4 Quality Education



With the introduction of NEP-2020, eight vocational, sixteen elective, a number of certificate, add on, value added, courses have been started to provide inter-disciplinary options and academic flexibility. The college has opened its Local Chapter on SWAYAM NPTEL. To promote research culture in the institution, the IQAC motivates the advanced learners and faculty to register for PhD, write research papers and participate in seminars and conferences. Experiential, participative and, collaborative learning is ensured through Field Project, Internship, Apprenticeship and Community Engagement. Study tours, field trips, expert lectures, classroom seminars, peer teaching, problem solving, group discussions and many other methods have enriched the learning experience of the students. Teachers use ICT to make learning more individualised, creative and dynamic. The teachers have participated in the FDP on E-Content Development and have developed e-content for the LMS of DHE, Go MP.
